Principal's Chat:

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Members of the Kyneton High School Community,

Our start to Semester 2 has been very positive and the overall picture is that of students resuming their learning with enthusiasm. It is especially pleasing to see students enjoying the hands on and practical elements of their learning. (please see collage in this edition)

Whilst we have not had the complications to our normal routines that schools in the metro Melbourne and Mitchell Shire schools have had to manage, there are some protocols that we have introduced for students and staff who live in these areas. One of these is that daily temperature checks have been taken since the start of Term 3. Furthermore, there was a new announcement by the Victorian premier stating as of midnight Wednesday 22nd July, it will be mandatory for residents of Mitchell Shire and the Melbourne metropolitan area to wear masks/face coverings in public to assist in curbing further spread of COVID19.

The latest information from the Department of Education and Training is that:

"Students who live in metropolitan Melbourne or Mitchell Shire and attend a school outside these areas are not required to wear a face covering at school. However, if staff live in metropolitan Melbourne or Mitchell Shire and work outside of these areas, they must continue to wear a face covering".

Teachers/Staff are NOT required to wear face coverings whilst teaching/instructing students. At other times you may notice that staff will be wearing face masks for one of two reasons:

- 1. They live in metropolitan Melbourne or Mitchell Shire and must continue to wear a face covering, or
- 2. Staff have chosen to wear a face covering

Students ARE NOT required to wear face coverings at school, but may do so if they wish.

The strict hygiene practices introduced last term will remain ongoing, with all students having regular access to hand sanitiser and adults in the school adhering to social distancing requirements. Extra cleaning during the day is also in operation, taking particular care with high touch and contact areas.

Principal's Report Cont.

As you are aware, our regular Parent Teacher Meeting day for Semester 1 was cancelled due to the Covid-19 situation. We had planned on rescheduling the event to Term 3, hoping that we would be able to allow parents on-site for face-to-face meetings as the situation improved. However, due to further restrictions in metro Melbourne and Mitchell Shire, and with many of our families working in those areas, face-to-face meetings will not be practical this term.

We understand however that some parents/carers may want to raise questions or concerns about their child's progress when the Cycle 3 reports are published at the end of this week.

Parents/carers are invited to message teachers on XUNO with any questions that you may have about your child's report.

You can also make an appointment for a telephone meeting which will be conducted in a similar fashion to how many medical appointments are now conducted over the phone – a timeframe will be given for your requested meeting, and the teacher will ring you within that timeframe. Phone appointments are available between 3.50-4.50 pm from Monday 27th – Thursday 30th July and will be up to 10 minutes long (the standard length we schedule for face-to-face meetings). You can make a booking for a telephone meeting using the XUNO parent portal. Please note that phone bookings are very limited as teachers are conducting these at the end of their working day.

Of course, if you have any questions on an ongoing basis or are unable to schedule a phone meeting, please contact individual teachers using Xuno Messages. Teachers will respond in a timely fashion either by return email or phone call (teachers who work part-time will respond on days that they are at work).

VIRTUAL OPEN DAYS 2020

Getting the most out of a Virtual Open Day

Participate in a Virtual Open Day from the comfort your own home!

Most institutional Virtual Open Days will be held in late July and August (see over the page for Open Day dates). However, you are more than welcome to contact an institution at any time for advice on courses.

Students are encouraged to register for as many Virtual Open Day events as possible and register soon!

Who should participate in a Virtual Open Day?

Anyone who is considering studying at a tertiary level in the next few years should attend.

Why should you attend a Virtual Open Day?

Apart from the opportunity to obtain course information there are many other reasons for participating:

- You are going to feel more comfortable arriving at a university or TAFE institute on the first day of classes if you have done your research and found out more about the institution.
- What is really involved in the course or courses you are interested in?
- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- Will you be happier studying in a large metropolitan institution or a smaller, perhaps rural institution?
- What does the place 'feel' like? Watch or participate in Virtual Tours, and try gaining an insight into whether or not it is a bustling environment with lots of activity, or a quieter, more relaxed campus set in landscaped grounds?
- How are you going to get there? Is it close to public transport or should you start saving now for a car? If you don't know the answers to any of these questions, then you should participate in a Virtual Open Day

How to make the best of Virtual Open Days

To make your Virtual Open Day activity fun and informative, here are some pointers:

- Write down a list of questions you would like to ask about particular courses if they are not addressed during the virtual event, you can always follow up with the institutions later
- If the event allows Q & A, make sure you ask lots of questions
- Enjoy the activity!

Not everyone can participate in all Virtual Open Days and various institutions are also holding their Virtual Open Days on the same date, so students are encouraged to register for as many as possible so that even if you miss one, you should receive notifications from the institutions and may be sent recordings if they are available

Science Competition



Calling all budding scientists and science communicators!

More than ever STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) is involved in our everyday lives. In order to make well-informed decisions, about our health, our environment and even politics, we all need accurate unbiased information.

An important responsibility for any scientist, budding scientist, or science communicator is sharing the science and passion for their subject. Science communication is a powerful tool to provide people with information that inspires and informs. FAKENEWS

We have all heard about fake news right? It is more important than ever to be able to identify and cut through false information and effectively and accurately communicate Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.



One of the most effective ways to get a message across is by using video - and we are able to create amazing video using everyday devices; phones, tablets and computers! The best part is that we are able to do this anywhere - from our schools, or from our homes, which during these challenging times and with home schooling is a big plus! So, what is the ask?

The challenge...

veski wants YOU to get creative and produce a STEM video to compete for the veski STEM filminators video of the year!

As a veski STEM filminators, simply choose a STEM subject and how you create the video is entirely up to you! It could be a video to convince kids to get into Engineering, a short documentary perhaps on a new scientific discovery or a topic you have been learning in a STEM lesson - anything goes...animation...film... as long as it is about STEM!

Key information

Groups of up to 5 students can collaborate to produce a STEM video, with the finalists to be shown during National Science Week. Individual entries are also allowed.

The STEM video must run for approximately 100 seconds (that's 1 minute and 40 seconds).

An important part of the process is to identify your audience and the key message you want to communicate to them. We will be asking who your audience is when you submit your STEM video.

The video content must be your own. If any material used within your STEM video has copyright ownership, then you must get permission from the copyright owners to use this before submitting your video to **veski**. See below for some links to free sources of media.

Keep it simple....

Interested students should register NOW via www.veski.awardsplatform.com. After registering, you will need to provide the names and ages of the other students contributing to the STEM video, as well as your nominated science teacher.

When you have finished the online form and uploaded your STEM video, and pressed 'submit' an email will be sent to your nominated science teacher. Teachers are an important part of the process. When they receive this email they will be asked to review your video. This will complete the process, so make sure your keep them posted.

How to upload your video

Entries must be submitted through the **veski** Award Force website only: https://veski.awardsplatform.com/.

The deadline for submissions is 12.00 pm [AEST] on Friday, 7 August 2020.

Finalist's videos will be available for public viewing during the National Science Week (15-23 August 2020).

If you experience issues in uploading your entry or have any questions or concerns about the process, contact **veski** via email **veski@veski.org.au** before the Entry Deadline.

Students – it is a really good idea to keep at least one copy of your STEM video. **veski** is not responsible for any videos that are lost, damaged, or that do not upload properly.

Guidelines

Entry is free and open to Victorian secondary schools and their students.

Groups entering the competition must be made up of students from the same school.

STEM videos should be submitted in .mp4 format. A display resolution of 1280 x 720 will be accepted but 1920 x 1080 is preferred (aspect ratio of 16:9).

STEM video must be approximately 100 seconds in duration (1 minute and 40 seconds). The total length of the video should not exceed 125 seconds (2 minutes and 5 seconds), which includes up to 25 seconds of introduction with title screen (see the next point).

The first section of the STEM video should contain a 25 second introduction, including;

- who you are (introduce yourselves),
- which school you are a student at and
- why you chose to create the STEM video subject (including who your audience is)
 NOTE: The introduction has no specific format requirements and it does not count toward the 100 minutes of the main video. It can be a presentation slide with a voice over, photographs, or a video of the team, it is up to you. Get creative!

Students must ensure that all content in their STEM video is their own. It is the sole responsibility of the students to secure permission from any third party owners of content included in their video, including footage, music and images. **veski** takes no responsibility for any failure by an student(s) to obtain the necessary permissions. Videos found to contain unauthorised content will be disqualified. For more information on copyright visit here: https://www.artslaw.com.au/legal/raw-law/legal-information-for-film-and-video-makers/.

Each STEM video must have a Lead Producer to serve as the main point of contact. This should be the person who registers on the **veski** Awards Force platform - https://veski.awardsplatform.com/ Your details, and the details of the other students involved in the video's production will need to be added to the application form too.

No professional assistance is allowed. Non-students may assist with production but are limited to verbal guidance only (like teachers). Adults and non-students are allowed to be actors or cameramen but not content contributors.

veski reserves the right to include an information page or introduction to the video with **veski** information at the beginning or end of a submitted STEM video.

Judges will make their selection based on the accuracy of the science content, your science communication skills and your originality in communicating the STEM subject.

The judges' decision is final.

By submitting your entry, you give **veski** a non-exclusive, perpetual, irrevocable licence to use and reproduce your entry in whole or in part for the purposes of **veski** STEM filminators video of the year program or the purposes of promoting **veski** activities more generally.

Important information for teachers

Teachers are an important part of the STEM video submission process. Students will submit the details of their nominated STEM teacher, including their email address as part of their online entry. Once students have completed the form online, uploaded their video, and pressed 'submit' an email will automatically be generated to the nominated STEM teacher named within the application.

At this point the nominated teacher will be asked to review the student video submission and complete a declaration including;

- Confirmation that the science communicated within the STEM video submission is accurate
 to the best of the teacher's knowledge.
- On behalf of the students, the teacher will be required to confirm that, to best of their knowledge, all content (footage, music, and images) used in the STEM video submission has all the appropriate permissions secured. veski will not take any responsibility for any failure to obtain the necessary permissions and that STEM videos found to contain unauthorised content will be disqualified.
- To confirm that confirm that appropriate parental permissions for each student listed in the application is held by the school to take part in the veski STEM filminators video of the year program.
- To give veski, on behalf of the student and school, a non-exclusive, perpetual, irrevocable
 licence to use and reproduce the STEM video submission in whole or in part for the purposes
 of veski STEM filminators video of the year program or the purposes of promoting veski
 activities more generally.
 - Lastly the teacher should declare that they have reviewed the STEM video and the application submitted by the students and confirm that the STEM video complies with all the necessary requirements set out.
