

Principal's Chat:

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Members of the Kyneton High School Community,

Our Principal Ana Rees is currently on leave visiting her ill father in New Zealand. The impact of COVID restrictions means additional time away restricted to hotel quarantine, however Ana has been able to stay connected and involved via email and webex meetings. We wish her well at this time and hope she can make the most of the chance to reunite with family.

Thank you for your patience and resilience this term! We have reached the end of term 3 with an empty school as we endure the stage 3 restrictions and Remote Learning 2. Despite the challenges many students have effectively adjusted to this different learning and continued to meet requirements and expectations. A good number of students at each year level achieved 100% attendance during this time –which in addition to their great participation is testament to their adept technology skills! We know it has not been easy for everyone and that it is hard to tackle issues without direct assistance. Our teachers, year level leaders, wellbeing team and support staff have tried really hard to support students and parents through various barriers. Persistence and communication have proven to be the key to success.

The response to student and parent surveys regarding Remote Learning 2 acknowledged the improvements put in place to assist students with timetabling, workload and contact with teachers. You can see some of this feedback later in the newsletter. We appreciate your views and suggestions for further improvements but let's hope we don't need another round.

Our current advice for the return to onsite learning is that students will return on a staggered start in week 2 next term. The easing of restrictions for regional Victoria means a return for primary schools from the start of term 4, however secondary schools will maintain the planned approach to continue remote learning in week 1 to enable the safe and uninterrupted implementation of the GAT exam for students doing Unit 3 & 4 VCE subjects or scored year 12 VET.

Week 1 Oct 5 - 9 – only essential VCE assessments onsite and students with approved on-site attendance for remote learning.

Wed 7th Oct - GAT

All other learning continues with remote program from home.

Week 2 Term 4 – proposed staggered return to onsite learning

Monday 12th - Year 11 & 12

Tuesday 13th - Year 7

Wednesday 14th - Year 8

Thursday 15th - Year 9 & 10

Designed to avoid all returning at once and to allow time to adjust.

Year 10s in a step-up subject can attend for that subject when it is timetabled.

If there is any change to this we will let you know.

We realise how quickly the virus can be spread and therefore hygiene practices and wearing masks will continue until further notice. The same applies to students coming prepared with their own equipment ready to learn.

There will still be many limitations for the remainder of the year, however in term 4 we aim to focus on re-establishing routines and relationships, ensure essential learning and assessment continues and prepare for progressions in our Begin 2021 programs.

We hope you can enjoy the holiday break with the better weather and the chance to go beyond your own backyard.




Survey 3= 149 v. Survey 2 161 responses








Parents words to describe where they're at . . .







Wellbeing supported . . . Survey 3= 83% v. Survey 2 71%



Balancing remote learning . .




Enough info & comms from school . . . Students= 78% Parents = 80%

Do you have the XUNO app for notifications? 65 responses









Effective feedback . . . Survey 3= 79% v. Survey 2= 68%



EXCURIONS TO LOCAL INDUSTRIES

In the course of study for leaving certificate geography, the University requires the students to submit notebooks containing records of practical work. This includes reports on geographic and geological features of the district, records of meteorological data and accounts of local industries.

For the purposes of studying the local industries, twenty senior pupils of the Kyneton High School, accompanied by their geography master (Mr. S. K. Glover), visited the Kyneton butter factory and the Kyneton Timber mill on Wednesday.

At the butter factory the students were conducted over the works by Mr. D. L. McKenzie, who explained the various stages regarding the processing of butter, while at the timber mill Mr. M. Ogden gave an interesting account of the timber industry from the forest to the home.

Later the students will visit the Lincoln Knitting Mills, where, as in previous years, Mr. J. Roberts very kindly explains the industrial process of the factory.

Thanks are due to the managers of these local industries for their assistance to the students.
