Principal's Chat:

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Members of the Kyneton High School Community,

Term 4 has started but it feels like a double start as the first week we continued remote learning to enable the safe implementation of the GAT exam. This went very smoothly thanks to the dedication of our senior team who supported the year 11 & 12 students involved. Week 2 is when we return to our regular times, timetable and classes. The staggered return for year levels allows attention to the needs for each level. Thank you for your support with this as we know students and parents are generally very keen for school to resume. (please see Upcoming Events in this edition for dates)

Some important reminders about the conditions directed by the department and Chief Health Officer that we need to adhere to are:

- All students and staff are required to wear a mask. This includes while travelling on the bus.
 Exemptions will only be granted where a medical certificate/letter is presented to the school.
 We know it can be uncomfortable, however making this adjustment for now is a way to help protect self and others.
- Students must come to school prepared with their own books, pens, water bottle, and laptop and charger. They should not share their belongings with others. A lot of class work will continue to require use of laptops so it is essential to bring this item each day.
- Hygiene practices will be a daily focus. We have many hand sanitiser points in each learning area and students need to wash their hands regularly as required.
- Social distancing is recommended and we will work within this framework as far as practical. No hugs or handshakes for now.
- Students need to stay home if they are unwell. If a student becomes ill at school parents will be contacted to collect them. It is important to get tested if any COVID symptoms are present.

We know how quickly the virus can spread and we all need to respect the restrictions put in place to protect our safety and the safety of our family members and other contacts.

Our Principal is not yet back from New Zealand but has regular contact and involvement.

We are really looking forward to seeing everyone again. Our focus will be on re-establishing school routines and supporting individuals with their wellbeing and their learning.

There will be restrictions to many of the usual term 4 events and celebrations but we will find a 2020 way to make them happen.

Students Look Forward To Face To Face Learning

Kyneton High School students, along with students from across the state, are looking forward to returning to school next week after months of home schooling due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Students from the leadership team recently met outside the school in front of the sign the team wrote to boost morale during the lockdowns.

Principal Ana Rees said everyone had been placed outside their comfort zones.

"It's all about resilience. It's about looking for the best within yourself and your family," Ms Rees said.

"For the year 12 students their whole year has just been thrown up in the air. There is a lot of pressure on them. They are missing all these important rituals, like the valedictory dinner.

"I don't know whether our sense of hope has been stretched. We've taken so much for granted. You have to dig deep; you have to be optimistic. You look for solutions.

"It's been hard for our school community in the depths of winter when we were isolated at home. But it's our attitudes and values that carry you through. It's that compass within you. You have to make sure that compass is pointing in the right direction."

Year 11 student leader Chloe Goodwin said when she heard that there were cases at Sacred Heart as well as Kyneton High it made COVID-19 seem so much more real and personal.

"It hit home to know that really nowhere was safe and that just because we live in the country area doesn't mean that we escaped the reality of this pandemic," she said.

"COVID-19 has made me cherish having face-to-face contact with not only the students but the teachers as well. "It's affected not only my schooling life but everyday life as well.

"It's just made me more mindful for the things I take for granted and how easily they can be taken away in an instant. "As humans we need human connection, it's just a part of who we are.

"I am terrified for the future aftermath that COVID-19 will bring for not only our economic climate but the structure of everyday life."

The student leadership team spoke of a sense of disconnection and a mix of emotions, good and bad, during the lockdown. They felt a fear of the unknown, and for what the future held.

"The whole world is struggling, but if we can get through a pandemic, we can get through anything," one student leader said.

"We're living in a future history lesson, in 10 years kids will be taking notes on this in preparation for an exam," added Amy Falkai who is in year nine and on the student leadership team.

Many parents across the state will be breathing a sigh of relief as their children return to face-to-face learning.

Returning to school anxiety free

CORONAVIRUS SUPPORT

Going back to school after the enforced COVID-19 break is a source of mixed emotions for many children and young people. Some students, who revel in face-to-face interactions, just can't wait to reconnect with friends

and teachers. Others who have appreciated the break from constantly being emotionally switched on when at school may be reticent to return.

Regardless of how your child reacts there's bound to be a level of anxiety attached to returning to school after such a long break. The following strategies sourced from my book, Anxious Kids, will help your child make a smooth transition back to school.

Park your expectations

School undoubtedly will be a different experience for students post COVID-19. It may require you to adjust your expectations, particularly academically, so patience is definitely required. Education is a long game, so if you are worried about your child missing the educational beat, recognise that this experience has been a blip on the educational curve. It's worth remembering that anxiety loves company. Park your expectations for a time, so your child won't pick up your anxieties.

Understand that their anxiety is real

An anxious child desperately wants a parent to understand that they feel anxious and apprehensive. Even if, you can't comprehend the impact that a return to school has on their state of mind and physiology, recognise that their anxiety is real. "Ah, I see you're worried that you won't know what to do when you go to school" is the type of response that an anxious child wants from a parent. Validating your child's feelings will help them feel safe and secure, putting them in a good position to make a return to school. "Mum/dad know that I'm feeling nervous" is very reassuring for a child.

Prepare them

Worriers and anxious types in particular, like to know what's ahead. Prepare your child for a return by discussing the safety procedures the school will be implementing. Let young children know that an adult won't be accompanying them past the school gate. Ask your child what they are looking forward to and check in with how they are feeling about a return. Check in regularly with how they are feeling and correct any misconceptions.

Focus on reconnection

Make reconnection the theme for your child's return to school. He or she will have to reconnect with friends, teachers and learning, which takes time. In all likelihood, your child's teachers will use many strategies to help your child connect with their friends, reflect on their time at home and move them back into full-time learning mode. Support these activities and reassure your child that they'll feel comfortable very soon with their school experience.

Stay off the roundabout for a while

This period will mirror the start of the school year when your child had to adjust to new teachers, different classmates and a new year level. Adjusting to change takes a great deal of personal energy, so your child or young person may become tired, grumpy, and even moody at home. Make allowances for these personal changes and make sure they have plenty of free time to unwind after school to relax and play.

Take care of yourself

In recent months parents and teachers have been doing significant emotional labour. The learning and adjustment curves have been massive, with little time to relax and take a break. Consider your own emotional resources and make your wellbeing a priority, which will make it easier for you to stay calm if your child experiences difficulties.

The COVID-19 pandemic has thrown many difficulties, requiring us all to quickly adapt to new situations. Flexibility is a prime characteristic of resilient people, so if nothing else, getting through these times will make us all more resilient.
